#### Welcome back!

Essential information that you need to know is included in this syllabus. You are required to keep this syllabus at the beginning of your orchestra binder as a reference. Our goal is for each ensemble to work as a team, and to learn and perfect to the best of our group's ability a wide range of quality orchestral literature. In order to achieve this goal as an ensemble, the following criteria must be met and they are the basis for the grading policy of this class.

Grades will be based upon: Performances (30%); Tests (25%); Rehearsals (25%); Written Assignments (10%); Instrument Care and Preparation (10%)

- 1. Proper Rehearsal Conduct As your instructors, we will not allow you to do anything that is not in your best interest or in the best interest of this ensemble. That means we will not allow you to stop anyone from learning or stop us from teaching. Please refrain from talking and playing out of turn during rehearsals. Your grade will suffer if you do not adhere to this policy. Please leave your conversations outside of the rehearsal room and your focus inside the rehearsal room.
- **Musical Preparedness** You must have the following: (*If you need any of these supplies, please see Mrs. Swenson or Mr. Aiello.*)
  - Black 1" ring binder
  - Pencils
  - Musical supplies relevant to instrument; e.g. rosin, strings, reeds, valve oil

**Don't rely upon your stand partner to bring the music.** By doing so, you will miss out on important phrasing, fingerings etc. Everyone must have their own binder to make appropriate markings. Please have your music organized in alphabetical order so that you can find pieces quickly. Binder checks will occur periodically during the school year without warning.

#### Recommended Materials

Listed above are <u>recommended</u> materials for students taking orchestra. Full participation in the course does not require the purchase of any of these materials. State law requires us to provide a public education free of charge. Subject to certain exceptions, the right to a free public education means we cannot require students or their families to purchase materials, supplies, equipment or uniforms for any school activity, to pay security deposits for access, participation, materials, or equipment, or to make donations to a class activity or program.

3. **Playing tests** – will either be live and videotaped or students will submit recordings via Google Classroom. Late submissions will result in a lower grade and will affect seating. Below are details for your first test.

#### Symphony -

Aug. 28 (violins and bass); Sept. 4 (viola and bass), Sept. 9 (ww/brass); Sept. 12 (cellos). You will be assigned a time in the afternoon or evening for this seating audition. Be prepared to play the CODA scales, All State excerpts and portions of Beethoven 5. There will be sight-reading portion as well. A schedule will be posted on the bulletin board outside the orchestra room. Winds/Brass should be prepared to play the CBDA audition requirements (scales and excerpts) as well as an assigned excerpt. A schedule will be posted on the bulletin board outside the orchestra room.

#### Philharmonic -

Aug. 29 (ww and brass); Sept. 5 (violin); Sept. 12 (cello); and Sept. 17 (basses/violas). This test will be live and you will be assigned a time in the afternoon or evening. You should be prepared to play the CODA scales and CODA excerpts for Honor String Orchestra and one excerpt from the CODA Symphony Orchestra. There will be sight-reading portion as well. A schedule will be posted on the bulletin board outside the orchestra room.

**Intermezzo and Sinfonia -** The first test for Intermezzo and Sinfonia will be a videotape test conducted during class time beginning on the week of Sept. 9<sup>th</sup>. Intermezzo students should be prepared to play the CODA Honors String Orchestra scale as well as the CODA String Orchestra excerpts. Sinfonia students will be assigned one CODA String Orchestra excerpt as well as the CODA assigned scale.

Concert and String Orchestras – The first test for Concert and String Orchestras will be scheduled once school starts.

- 4. **Punctuality in class, sectionals and concert call times** Once class begins, you have 2 minutes to get to your seat. This includes wind/brass and percussion players. **Once you have entered the classroom, talking must end because some students are already in the process of tuning.** There should never be talking and extraneous noise during tuning.
- 5. Attendance in class and at sectionals Missed rehearsals impact the entire ensemble and count towards your final grade. Sinfonia has rehearsal during Flex-Time and Intermezzo, Philharmonic, and Symphony have rehearsals after school. Please try to avoid making doctor or dentist appointments during rehearsal time. If you are on a sports team and if there is a game scheduled, you may make up the absence. Please try to work out a schedule with your coach and explain that afterschool rehearsals are a requirement. Rehearsals may also be made up for illness.
- To Make Up a Missed Rehearsal for SINFONIA, INTERMEZZO, PHIL, SYMPHONY and CHAMBER students: The procedure for making up a missed rehearsal is to submit a flash drive of your practice for that week The practice time must be 90 minutes for Sinfonia and Intermezzo and 120 minutes for Phil, Symphony and Chamber. It must contain at least 60 minutes of practice on orchestral music. The remaining minutes may be your scales, etudes or solo work. Practice should be a normal part of your routine, so submitting recordings is truly easy to do. If you prefer, you can also share the recording on google drive. Remember that missing a rehearsal because of excessive homework is not excusable. Please plan ahead.
  - If rehearsals are missed due to a sports conflict, it is important to have at least one rehearsal grade during a grading period. Please have a conversation with Mrs. Swenson or Mr. Aiello if you cannot make at least one rehearsal during a six-week grading period.
  - Flash drives must be clearly marked with your name and turned in within one week of the missed sectional.
  - Flash drives must be accompanied with a note from your parent giving the date and reason for the absence. If you are sharing your recording on Google, please have your parents send an email giving the specifics of the absence.
  - Recording media submitted without a note or email will be returned and not be counted.

- 7. Participation at Concerts Performances are a major part of your grade and are excused only for extreme illness and/or family emergency. A note, email or phone call is needed if a performance is missed. Before and after concerts, it is everyone's responsibility to set up and take down. This will be done on a rotating basis and will be handled by our orchestra stage managers.
- 8. Written Assignments Occasionally, you will be given written assignments that will also count in your final grade. Additionally, memos that go home and have to be signed and returned are always graded assignments.

- 9. Proper care of Equipment Please be responsible enough to put away your instrument and music. Instruments left out will result in a lowered equipment care grade. Lockers must always be locked! The orchestra room is frequently rented out to outside groups, so locking is imperative. Please keep your locker clean and free of heavy books. Food should never be kept in your instrument locker, as it will attract insects and other creatures. Loosen your bows and clean the rosin off of your instrument daily. Cello and Bass players will be assigned to one instrument to use. Please do not use another instrument. All instruments go back in the assigned cabinet and should be locked after use. Failure to properly take care of equipment will adversely affect your grade.
- 10. Participation in Solo and Small Ensemble Festival is required of Intermezzo, Philharmonic and Symphony students. Students who do not perform in this festival may work a shift at this festival for partial credit. Your growth as a musician will be remarkable if you put forth the effort. Do not procrastinate in preparing for Solo and Small Ensemble. NOW is the time to plan. You may do a solo, duet, trio, quartet, quintet, etc. Check online (IMSLP.org) for literature ideas. Another good source is the UCLA Music Library as well as the LA Public Library (main branch) for music. We are available at lunch and after school to assist you in finding appropriate literature. Flex time could be used to practice in small ensembles. You may also consider participating in JCM (Junior Chamber Music). JCM will group you with musicians with similar abilities and as a group you will receive coaching. #### 11. Senior Gala Soloist Information:

- Seniors who would like to perform at the Senior Gala will be participating in a solo and small ensemble competition and heard by two independent judges on the same day as Solo and Small Ensemble Festival. There will be a separate application to apply to be a performer at the Senior Gala. If you do not wish to perform at the Senior Gala, please fill out the regular Solo and Small Ensemble application.
- The adjudicators will pick the **top 3 or 4 soloists or ensembles** who perform pieces with orchestral accompaniment. These senior soloists will have the opportunity of playing with the full orchestra at the Senior Gala.
- If a soloist is chosen to perform at the Senior Gala and is also a part of an ensemble which is selected, the student must choose.
- Additional Senior soloists and ensembles will also be selected to perform with piano accompaniment based upon the judges' scoring.
- Soloists and Ensembles are responsible for accompanist fees. However, if you are in need of financial assistance, please let Mrs.
   Swenson or Mr. Aiello know.
- A Senior Gala soloist must play the same piece that was performed at the Senior Solo and Small Ensemble Competition.
- Senior Gala pieces should be a maximum of 10 minutes. Soloists should work out cuts if their piece is longer than this time frame.

#### Other things you should know ...

#### 12. Stay informed:

- Check the bulletin board outside the orchestra room frequently. A calendar is posted that will keep you informed of rehearsals, concerts, important deadlines, etc.
- Check your email frequently for any changes, notices, etc. If you are not receiving emails, register online.
- Use the orchestra website. On the home page, there is a calendar with important dates and deadlines. Additionally, some of your music will be on the website. www.samohiorchestras.com

#### 13. Samohi Student Orchestra Board:

- The Samohi Student Orchestra Board will be elected shortly
- Board members will assist in the everyday functions of the group.
- We will need to elect a President, Vice-President, Secretary, (3) Stage Managers and (2) Librarians as well as a representative from
  each orchestra. The President will also serve as a student member of the OPA Executive Board as described in the OPA Operating
  Procedures. This individual will be expected to attend OPA Executive Board Meetings as a representative of all Samohi
  Orchestras students.
- **14.** Eating during class time is absolutely not permitted. Water is permissible.
- 15. Use of the Barnum restrooms is **not** allowed during normal school hours unless we are rehearsing in Barnum that day. The Barnum restrooms will be unlocked at the end of Per. 6. Restrooms located in the choir room may be used between classes, before and after school. Other facilities near the music building are located in the locker rooms adjacent to the music building.

#### 16. Orchestra Attire:

*Women* – Long, solid, black attire. This could be dressy slacks, skirts or dresses. If there is a slit in the skirt, it may not go above the knee. Spaghetti straps, tank tops, halter-tops, low cut necklines, bare midriffs and backs are not appropriate concert attire and cannot be worn.

Men – Men in orchestras are required to wear a black tuxedo or black suit, white shirt, black bowtie, black socks and black dress shoes. No athletic shoes. Elite Tuxedo offers Samohi music students a complete tuxedo rental package for the entire school year for \$115. The rental includes a tuxedo jacket, pants, white tuxedo shirt, cummerbund, and black bow tie. Elite will be on campus in the beginning of the year to measure those men wishing to rent or purchase a tuxedo. If you prefer, you can visit Elite Tuxedo at 2074 Westwood Blvd. Be sure to call ahead (310) 474-9090 and tell them you're a Samohi music student. Please see Mrs. Swenson or Mr. Aiello should you need assistance with concert attire.
